Dear Overleigh Family,

Thank you to all the children and staff for all their amazing hard work this half term. It has been a long 8 weeks but we have packed lots in. We hope you enjoy sharing a flavour of our learning in the newsletter and wish everyone a very enjoyable half term.

Attendance is showing a marked increase on this time last year although penalty notices are still being required for those taking term time holidays. We do hope the extra Inset days either side of the half term will help families to take a break out of term time.

Punctuality has slipped a little in the last 2 weeks of term which is a bit frustrating as we had several days and nearly a whole week previously, with no lates. We understand the roadworks are causing delay and we have had a lot of rain but delays are to be expected under these circumstances. Thank you to everyone who has allowed ex-



tra time and ensured their children are able to come into school with their classmates through the normal classroom doors in the morning. We have not given an individual award to children with 96%+ attendance this half term, as we normally would, but have congratulated classes as a whole. This is due to the high number of cases of chicken pox, foot and mouth and vomiting bugs that have been doing the rounds. We have regularly reminded children to use soap and water, and not just hand gel, to clean their hands regularly through the school day. It would be great families could also remind children over the break.

CHESHIRE DIOCESE ACADEMY TRUST (CDAT)

Our conversion has been further delayed by dispute over the road between the LA and CDAT. Consequently at the earliest, we will convert on 01.12.24. Regular meetings are being held with DfE and we hope progress is secured quickly to resolve the matter. In the mean time we continue to be a maintained setting although CDAT teams have been working closely with us for support.



OFSTED

As we did not convert to an academy on 01.10.24 we were visited by Ofsted. It was a full inspection as expected and there were 3 inspectors for 2 full days. We are awaiting the draft and then final reports which should be with us after half term and will be shared with you as soon as we are able. Thank you for all the kind wishes of support during the process and all those who contributed to their questionnaires. We do not get to see the findings from these but a summary was verbally shared.

Many thanks to all the children who represented themselves and the school so brilliantly and to all the staff for all the extra special hard work during the inspection period.

As ever we continue now on our journey of ensuring our school is the very best place it can be for all children, staff and families.

Winter Clothing

We are very lucky to have such a big school but as it is surrounded by windows it is almost always too hot in the summer and too cold in the winter. Do please make sure your child has a school jumper or cardigan and a warm coat to wear. Please name these items!

PE kits can contain black jogging bottoms and an extra sweatshirt as most classes will continue with outside PE as long as the weather allows i.e. it isn't



bucketing down!! Where at all possible, please leave PE and Forest School kits in for the half term. This saves remembering each week. Please remember to label it with your child's name and ensure they are in school for Tuesday 5th November. Thank you.

Head Pupil Election

Well done to all the children who entered the challenge to become head Pupil. As ever competition was tight, but this year especially, we were impressed with the quality of entry from across the school. Consequently, we have made a change to the election process for the first time in many years. This year we will have 6 rather than 4 candidates i.e. party leaders for the position of Head Pupil. In addition, we will also have 6 further candidates for the position of Deputy Head Pupil (from our earlier aged year groups). This means there will be 2 elections on the same day, one for Head Pupil and one for Deputy Head Pupil with 6 candidates for each role. All the children who entered the challenge have willingly agreed to become party members to support the Head and Deputy head candidates. We were especially impressed with how our Y5 & Y6 children who were not chosen to be party leaders but have welcomed the opportunity to support younger members of the school with their campaign. A wonderful example of showing love and respect towards each other.

After half term, the various party leaders and party members will be campaigning to gain voters in the election. As part of this they will make speeches to the rest of school about why they should be chosen. All children and staff in school will have the opportunity to register to vote in the election.

CHRISTMAS


Well done to all those children who completed the challenge in Autumn 1 – 'Don't Give Up'.



Linda has been busy in gymnastics and received star of the week. Well done Linda!














In Geography, we learnt how to use a compass to find north, south, east and west. We have also drawn an aerial view of our classroom and a map of our route to school.
