This half term we will be focussing on the Christian value of Hope. We launched our Hope value in our whole school worship on Tuesday when we explored what we mean by 'Hope'. The Bible teaches us

that in God we have hope of life after death but it also teaches us that God is always with us and that he 'has our back' as it were so that even in the darkest of times and most difficult of days there is the Hope that things will get better because we know and trust that God is with us.

We listened to a story that helps to illustrate placing Hope in God's hands.

One night, a house caught fire and a young boy was forced to flee to the roof. The father stood on the ground below with outstretched arms, calling to his son, 'Jump! I'll catch you.' He knew the boy had to




jump to save his life. All the boy could see, however, was flame, smoke and blackness. As can be imagined, he was afraid to leave the roof. But his father kept yelling: 'Jump! I will catch you.' But the boy protested, 'Daddy, I can't see you.' His father replied, 'But I can see you, and that's all that matters.'



what we hope for, that isn't hope. Who hopes for what they already see? Bat if we hope for what we'don't see. we wait for it with patience. Romans 8:24-25



Throughout the day the children were thinking about hope, what the Bible teaches us about hope and what hope means for them and others today.



The children will also be thinking about their own personal hopes for the future, which of these were earthly hopes (like wishes) and which of these hopes were Godly hopes that we should place in God's hands. We also thought about small things that we can do to give our lives meaning and worth which in turn will give hope to others.

We all have struggles and challenges and bad things do happen but the gift of hope enables us to keep us moving forward. Hope give us the fuel to face impossible challenges. Hope is the expectation that things will get better, that God has plan for us all and that we will get where we want or need to be when the time is right.
